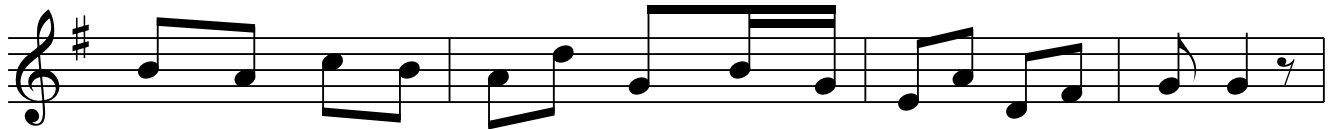


The Bells of Aberdovey



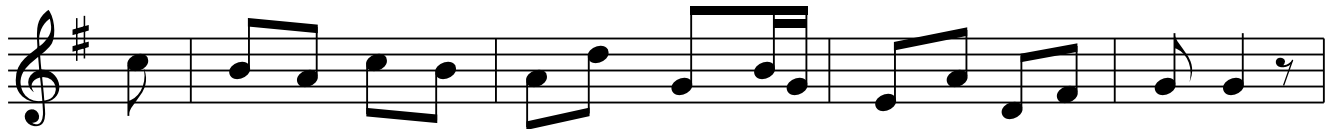
Gai-ly ring-ing o'er the dales. Hear the sil-v'ry chime which hails.

And ech-oes ans-ber as they sing, The bells of A-ber - dov-ey.



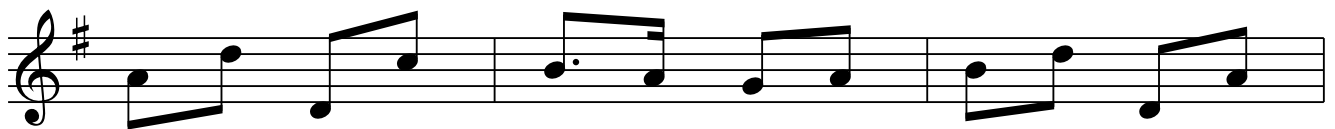
Soft and clear thro' all the land, The bells are call-ing clear-ly.



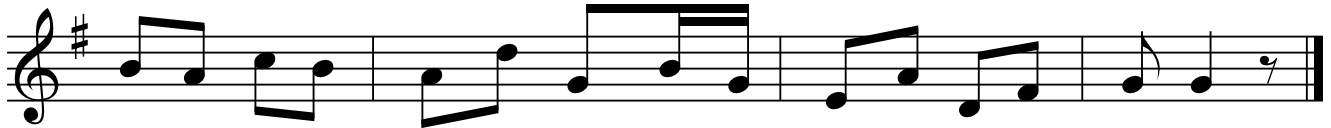
Ring-ing, Sing-ing as we stand In glades we love so dear-ly.
